Dear Coldstream Families,

Class configuration and student placement is a complex and challenging task for schools. Parents, students, and staff offer different perspectives on the needs of each child. It is the school's responsibility to place students into classes and ensure compliance with the varying constraints within the system.

Each year we have a variety of class sizes and compositions. Our objective is to organize classes that are balanced, taking into consideration a variety of factors as noted below. The decisions we make are based on our professional knowledge and consideration of all factors in the best interest of each student. School staff will work together as a team to organize classes for September.

When placing students, we consider the following criteria:

- 1. Enrolment numbers (contractual requirements)
- 2. Diversity in Development (academic ability)
- 3. Learning Needs (support that may be needed)
- 4. Family Relationships (siblings/cousins)
- 5. Personality
- 6. Teaching and Learning Styles
- 7. Age of the Student
- 8. Previous Placement History
- 9. Social/Emotional Dynamics (student interactions with each other)
- 10. Inclusion Services (diversity, learning needs and supports)
- 11. Parent Information (input is valued and considered though we may not be able to meet all specific requests)

Our team spends an incredible amount of time to make thoughtful decisions about class placements. Parental input, provided in writing or on this form (link below), regarding the educational best interests of their child is valued and will be taken into consideration whenever possible. In September, we will not make class placement changes unless there are extenuating circumstances in which the school team deems it appropriate to do so.

Please note that the purpose of this form is to provide us with additional information about your child and their learning strengths and needs that would help set your child up for success. Please support the integrity of the process by limiting your requests to the educational interests of your child rather than about choosing favourite teachers, friends, etc.
